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Detailed Itinerary

Day 1: Arrival in Leh

Return to your hotel for a restful overnight stay in Leh.

Day 3: Journey from Leh to Nubra Valley via Khardung La

Embark on a thrilling journey to Nubra Valley, a region known for its stunning landscapes, lush greenery, and unique desert terrain. The drive takes you through Khardung La, the world's highest motorable road at an elevation of 5,389 meters, offering breathtaking views of snowcapped peaks and winding mountain roads. After soaking in the mesmerizing sights at the pass, descend into the enchanting valley of Nubra.

Upon arrival, visit the iconic Diskit Monastery, home to a towering 32-meter-high Maitreya Buddha statue that overlooks the valley with a sense of serenity and grandeur. The monastery, one of the oldest and largest in Nubra, offers a fascinating insight into Buddhist culture and history.

Later, head to the famous Hunder sand dunes, where you will have the unique opportunity to witness the double-humped Bactrian camels, a rare species native to Central Asia. Enjoy a camel safari across the golden dunes, surrounded by an awe-inspiring blend of barren mountains and green valleys. As night falls, check into your accommodation in Nubra Valley for a peaceful overnight stay under the starlit Ladakhi sky.

Day 4: Exploring the Hidden Gem of Turtuk

Start your day with a scenic drive towards Turtuk, one of Ladakh's most picturesque and culturally rich villages. Nestled near the Indo-Pak border, Turtuk offers a unique blend of Ladakhi and Balti heritage, with its quaint stone houses, lush apricot orchards, and welcoming locals. As you wander through the village, you will experience a distinct cultural shift, evident in the language, traditions, and cuisine of the Balti people.

If time permits, venture to Thang Village, the last civilian-accessible point near the border, offering a rare glimpse into the landscapes that separate India and Pakistan.

The serene ambiance of Turtuk, combined with its stunning surroundings of rugged mountains and green pastures, makes it a truly offbeat destination. After a fulfilling day of exploration, retrace your journey back to Nubra Valley, where you will spend another night amidst the tranquil landscapes of this high-altitude wonderland.

Day 5: Nubra Valley to the Enchanting Pangong Lake

Wake up to the crisp mountain air and set out on an early morning drive towards the worldfamous Pangong Lake. Depending on road conditions, you will take either the Shyok route or the adventurous Wari La Pass, both offering dramatic landscapes and pristine natural beauty. As you approach Pangong Lake, the first sight of its vast, shimmering blue waters against the stark brown mountains will leave you spellbound. Located at an altitude of 4,250 meters, this stunning lake stretches across India and Tibet, changing its hues from deep blue to turquoise as the day progresses.

Spend the afternoon at leisure, strolling along the lake's edge, capturing breathtaking photographs, or simply soaking in the serenity of the surroundings. As night falls, the clear skies above Pangong offer a spectacular view of the Milky Way, making it an unforgettable stargazing experience. Settle into your accommodation by the lake for an overnight stay, embracing the tranquility of this magical destination.

Day 6: Return to Leh via Chang La Pass

Bid farewell to Pangong Lake as you embark on your return journey to Leh. The route takes you through Chang La Pass, one of the highest mountain passes in the world, standing tall at 17,688 feet. En route, visit the renowned Hemis Monastery, the largest and wealthiest monastery in Ladakh, known for its rich collection of ancient Buddhist relics, stupas, and intricate thangkas. If you haven't visited Thiksey Monastery earlier in the trip, this is another chance to explore its architectural marvels and spiritual ambiance.

For a lighter, more modern experience, stop by the famous Rancho School, also known as the Druk White Lotus School, made famous by the Bollywood film *3 Idiots*. After a fulfilling day of exploration, return to Leh and check into your hotel, where you can enjoy a relaxing evening before your final day in Ladakh.

Day 7: Departure from Leh

As your incredible Ladakh adventure comes to an end, it's time to bid farewell to this land of stark beauty and spiritual tranquility. After breakfast, check out from your hotel and transfer to Leh Airport for your onward journey, carrying with you memories of snow-capped peaks, turquoise lakes, and the warm hospitality of Ladakh's people. With experiences that blend adventure, culture, and breathtaking landscapes, this journey through Ladakh will remain etched in your heart forever.
